Enjoy – Great Yarmouth is a partnership that provides a forum for arts and cultural organisations to work with schools, colleges and other educational providers to increase the opportunities for children and young people to learn by engaging in arts and cultural activities. This is one of a number of Cultural Education Partnerships that has been set up across the country by Arts Council England to meet the Cultural Education Challenge:

How can schools get involved?

We want as many schools as possible to join the partnership so that you can help to shape plans to develop arts and cultural provision in the Great Yarmouth area. To do this please complete the following survey form. This is to help us assess what your school is already doing well and where you would like support from arts and cultural organisations to further develop the range of arts and cultural activities available to students. This could be during lesson times or extra-curricular activities. After we receive your survey form we will get in touch to discuss your school's plans and send you regular updates on network activities.

How will this be funded?

There is no funding attached to this scheme. However, we will seek to link schools to arts and cultural organisations with existing funding or work with schools to prepare funding bids to Arts Council England, Heritage Lottery Fund and other funding providers to support activities linked to the pledge scheme. While we cannot guarantee that these funding bids will succeed we know that bids from the partnership will be favourably received as Great Yarmouth has been identified as a priority area for the development of arts and cultural provision and engagement.

What is the Arts & Culture Pledge scheme?

The Pledge scheme has been created by a group of local head teachers to enable us to celebrate the achievements of schools in delivering a rich arts and cultural offer to students. It is also a statement of ambition for schools that would like to achieve more with our support. One school has already used this to good effect with Ofsted. If your school would like to sign up then please also return the attached pledge form.
