

Nursery Class Letter Spring 2 2020

<p>Things your child will be learning in the next few weeks</p>	<p>The children's current learning is focused around the text 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes' by Jan Fearnley. We will be discussing the characters and setting form story as well as discussing the moral of kindness. The children will develop their writing skills by writing their own shopping lists of the ingredients they need to make pancakes, before making their own pancakes focusing on the changes that take place during the cooking process. The children will learn to play 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes' lotto game, as well as take part in pancake races to develop their turn taking skills. The children will be using language for size to describe and compare the different sizes of play dough pancakes and develop their counting skills by counting out coins for Mr. Wolf.</p>
<p>Things you could explore at home to help your child's learning</p>	<p>Please support your child's writing development at home by writing a shopping list together before a trip to the supermarket, emphasise what sounds the words begin with as you write them e.g. milk – m.</p> <p>Play shops together with items you have at home. Make some price tags and take it in turns to take on the role of customer and shop keeper. Encourage your child to count out the correct number of coins to pay for items.</p> <p>Please continue to support your child with learning to write their first names, remembering to only use a capital for the first letter followed by lower case letters for the rest of the name.</p>
<p>Things happening in school</p>	<p>Linked to the topic of Mr. Wolf's Pancakes we will be discussing Lent. Lent is a time when Christians prepare for the joy of Easter. Lent gives Christians time to grow in their faith and get closer to God. Early Years will be learning some nursery rhymes as part of their Lent fundraiser. See nursery notice board for further details.</p> <p>Easter stay and play – Thursday 2nd April 9am – 10am.</p>
<p>Please take note of these points</p>	<p>The children change their library books every Monday.</p> <p>Please ensure that your child has a spare set of clothes kept on their pegs.</p>
