### Learning

During this half term the children's learning will be focused around the theme of 'Celebrations'. We will be discussing what celebrations are and the children will be encouraged to share their own experiences of celebrations that they have participated in. We will be discussing Bonfire Night and the children will also be finding about the Hindu festival of light — Diwali, which will involve making their own Diva lamps as well as creating Rangoli patterns, developing their understanding that there are people of different faiths within our school community.

In RE the children will be celebrating advent, learning that this is a time to get ready for Christmas. The Christmas story will be shared with the children and we will discuss that God sent Jesus to love us all.
